

Finding I AM—What is the deep cry of your heart? That ache in your soul that keeps you up at night? The prayer you keep repeating? Jesus not only cares about this deep, spiritual wrestling, but He

also wants to step in and see you through it. Join facilitator Sally Gaertner in the green room on Wednesdays at 6:30 pm for this interactive video study for women. Written by Lysa TerKeurst, and filmed on the streets of Israel, this study explores the seven I AM statements of Jesus found in the Gospel of John. The cost of the learner guide is \$15.

Max Lucado's THE STORY—Tom & Jean Harris will facilitate an 8-month timeline Bible survey on Wednesday evenings at 6:30 pm in the old parlor. THE STORY, by Max Lucado, is our guide; scriptures and related discussions which emphasize how all the book of the Bible fit together are highlighted. 4 Attitudes to Embrace at Work

Here are four important attitudes when it comes to the arena in which we spend the majority of our lives: the workplace.

- 1. **Recognize the sacred gift of work.** We tend to think of work as a punishment, as a curse laid on us in a fallen world. But work shows up as part of God's creative process. Genesis 2:2 reminds us that God "rested on the seventh day from all his work that he had done." Adam was to "work and watch over" the beautiful Garden of Eden (Genesis 2:15). Rather than a punishment, work was a gift of grace from God to man, the opportunity to imitate God's creative acts by subduing creation. Work only became difficult when sin entered the world. Now rather than being an endless source of worship and creativity, work is toil. The earth, now touched by sin and death, would fight back (Genesis 3:17-19).
- 2. **Remove the divide between secular and sacred work.** Many Christians hold a distinction between "secular" and "sacred" work. But Scripture doesn't offer such a workplace distinction because in God's economy all work brings glory to him. In his letter to the Colossians, Paul quotes King Solomon's advice: "Whatever you do, do it enthusiastically, as something done for the Lord and not for men" (Colossians 3:23).
- 3. **Revive a healthy work-life balance.** Since creation, God instituted patterns for healthy rhythms of work and rest. God worked six days and rested on the seventh. This pattern was enforced as law for the nation of Israel as a way of relaxing and reminding the Jewish people of their humanity and need for God. Today, followers of Jesus are no longer under the rigid enforcement of Sabbath law, but Scripture reminds us of the importance of rest. Jesus, in his full humanity, took periodic moments for rest of body and soul and counseled his disciples to do the same (Mark 6:30-32).
- 4. **Resist the lust for materialism.** Scripture is clear that wealth isn't, in and of itself, evil. Yet we know of the inherent dangers that prosperity can bring. Heed Paul's warning to young Timothy: "But those who want to be rich fall into temptation, a trap, and many foolish and harmful desires, which plunge people into ruin and destruction. For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evil, and by craving it, some have wandered away from the faith and pierced themselves with many pains" (1 Timothy 6:9-10). Greed, however, isn't a sin reserved for the rich. It's a matter of the heart. The cure for materialism is to reorient one's gaze from money and toward the giver of good gifts.

Bible Skills for Kids: Foundational on Sunday Mornings

When a child comes to First Baptist Church for Sunday morning Bible study, families can rest assured that our children's ministry leaders will emphasize biblical literacy and rich Bible study as, through the course of three years, preschoolers and children study BOOK BY BOOK THE ENTIRE BIBLE. That means a child who regularly attends Bible study throughout their childhood will work through the entirety of scripture **three times** before she reaches middle school.

Each session will help boys and girls focus on specific Bible skills. These Bible skills are age-appropriate, and build in difficulty as a child grows. There are many aspects in developing Bible skills (the authority of the Bible, reciting Bible books in order, understanding salvation, telling others about the Bible, practicing daily Bible reading, etc.). For example, when developing the skill of locating Bible verses:

- A younger preschooler can listen to brief Bible stories, and point to the Bible and pictures of Jesus.
- An older preschooler remembers and retells a familiar Bible story and Bible fact.
- A younger child will become familiar with the contents of specific books, such as: the Book of Genesis tells about God and His creation, the Book of Psalms contains songs about God, the Gospels tell about Jesus.
- An older child can locate Bible passages in a limited time frame, and can locate from memory often-used Bible passages and memory verses such as: the Model Prayer, the Ten Commandments, and the Sermon on the Mount.

BUILDING BIBLE SKILLS for a lifetime begins now, and the children's ministry of FBC wants children to treasure God's Word. Families, the children's ministry at FBC takes seriously our responsibility to **support and equip you** as you become a *Deuteronomy* 6 family. Our prayer is that your child becomes grounded in rich Bible study that is heavily focused on biblical literacy so that a foundation for the child's life in Christ takes hold and lasts a lifetime.

Ministerial Alliance Celebrates 500th Protestant Reformation

The Floresville Ministerial Alliance has been celebrating "One Lord Jesus Christ" throughout 2017 by commemorating the historical significance of the day 500 years ago when a feisty monk in Wittenberg, Germany, questioned the church's teachings. Martin Luther wrote his "95 theses" and nailed them to the door of the Castle Church on October 31, 1517.


