Ministerial Alliance Celebrates 500th Protestant Reformation

The Floresville Ministerial Alliance has been celebrating "One Lord Jesus Christ" throughout 2017 by commemorating the historical significance of the day 500 years ago when a feisty monk in Wittenberg, Germany, questioned the church's teachings. Martin Luther wrote his "95 theses" and nailed them to the door of the Castle Church on October 31, 1517.

On Tuesday, October 31, 2017, between 6am and 4pm, ten churches in our community will read through the New Testament Gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John. The schedule is as follows:

Wilson County Collection Event

Wilson County will hold a collection day for any household hazardous waste, used tires, used electronics, and pharmaceutical waste on Saturday, October 21, 2017, from 8am to Noon, at the Precinct 1 Yard at 142 FM 536 in Floresville. This event is for residents of Wilson County only, and proof of address is required. Residential waste only; no businesses. There is no charge, but some items cannot be accepted.

What to Bring:

Acids, Antifreeze, Tires (with no rims), Batteries, Used automotive fluids (and filters), Household cleaning products (and those labeled "caution," "warning," or "poison"), Paint products (including varnish & solvents), Pool chemicals, Lawn & garden chemicals,

Herbicides & pesticides, Small appliances, TVs (no wooden console), Computer components & monitors, Pet Medication, Vitamins & herbal supplements, Prescription & non-prescription meds, Inhalers (leave all meds in original containers & black out personal information;

What NOT to Bring:

Tractor tires, Agricultural chemicals, Large appliances, Containers larger than 5 gallons, Explosives, Large propane cylinders, Radioactive materials, Industrial waste, Ammunition, Items with asbestos, Construction waste, Household/office furniture, Oxygen tanks, syringes, sharps, & lancets.

What NOT to Get Your Pastor for Pastor Appreciation Month

October is here, which means it is "Pastor Appreciation Month." Pastors should be appreciated all the time, and not just one month a year. Because I am no longer a "pastor" as my full-time job, I feel some freedom to speak a bit bluntly about some of the gifts our pastors may be in jeopardy of receiving the year. If you have given your pastor some of these gifts before, don't feel bad. There is no condemnation here—only grace. And your pastor really did know you cared, and was honored you remembered him. But I want to be helpful and encourage you NOT to get your pastor the following this year:

"Praying hands" décor-Hopefully he seeks the Lord for the joy of knowing God, for himself and his family, and for the church, and he doesn't need another set of "praying hands."

A leadership/church book you want him to read-He will likely wonder the entire time what deficiency you think he has in his leadership/ministry, and it will not be a relaxing read that feels like "appreciation."

A tie-This is especially true if the tie has Christian fish on it. Or a decorated Christmas tree.

A Bible-He already has one. If not, you need another church.

A pair of tickets to a scrub matchup–Many pastors like going to games, but if you're just looking for a charitable way to offload some tickets you can't use, please don't think of your pastor first.

A card with nothing in it-The workman is worthy of at least a Starbucks gift card.

5 Gifts for Your Pastors for Pastor Appreciation Month (and all the time)

While I am grateful for churches who express appreciation to pastors during October, it is far better for the pastors, their families, and the churches if the love, support, and encouragement is ongoing. Pastors sometimes struggle to point out particular passages of scripture because they can come off as self-serving, but that shouldn't be the case as these passages are in the Bible.

"Remember your leaders who have spoken God's word to you. As you carefully observe the outcome of their lives, imitate their faith... Obey your leaders and submit to them, for they keep watch over your souls as those who will give an account, so that they can do this with joy and not with grief, for that would be unprofitable for you. Pray for us; for we are convinced that we have a clear conscience, wanting to conduct ourselves honorably in everything." - Hebrews 13:7, 17-18

- 1. Pray for them. The greatest gift you can give your pastors is prayer. Pray that the Lord will keep them to Himself, pure and blameless. And pray for their families as their families shoulder the burden of ministry alongside them. You can't pray for someone and despise them at the same time.
- 2. Imitate their faith. Of course, this is a challenge for leaders to live holy lives in response to the grace of God. Obviously this does not mean that our pastors are perfect, but this does mean we should learn from our pastors; we should put into practice the faith we see displayed in them.
- 3. Follow their lead. In His providence, God places pastors in their places of ministry. The Lord gives them unique gifts and specific passion for the churches they serve and the communities they serve in. Their passion, sense of mission, and specific gifting will and should impact the direction of the church.
- 4. Pay them well. This is biblical. Too many pastors and their families are under unnecessary financial stress because some churches are not generous in this manner.
- 5. Help them love their families well. Don't put expectations on them that would equate to neglecting their families if they actually lived up to the expectations. Rejoice that your pastors disappoint others occasionally by not accepting all invitations so that they may invest more in their own families.

A pastor never "clocks out." A pastor is a pastor all of the time. The responsibility is enormous as, to quote Martyn Lloyd-Jones, the pastor "is given charge of souls." Let's encourage, love, and support our pastors as they seek to faithfully fulfill all the duties of their ministries.
