- Ashley began the Toledo School of Music on August 28, 2017. She now has 16 students and a growing waiting list. If only we could clone Ashley!
- God is doing some amazing things in Belize. In the last two months we have baptized 10 new believers in Christ. Praise the Lord!
- In early October, we were blessed to have Ashley's dad visit us for a week! We were all very glad to see him and Caleb was especially glad to see his grandad! He was also a big help on the house that week!

I have had the opportunity to baptize several in the last few months. One of those was a man named Clifford. I met Clifford over 3 years ago on a mission trip to Belize. On that trip Clifford was begging for money and food so a team member and

A Word from Your IMB Missionary in Japan...

Japan has 127 million people living in one of the most commercialized and technologically advanced countries in the world. Yet there are less than 1% who know Christ as their personal Lord and Savior. They truly have gained the whole world and lost their soul!

Families are failing. Young people are daily contemplating suicide. The extreme pressure to succeed is crushing many, from adults in the workplace to children in primary school. Promiscuity is the norm while love is seen as unrealistic. Buddhist temples and Shinto shrines dot the cityscapes filled with idols made by human hands. How will these millions ever know the joyous salvation offered by Jesus Christ? Is this a task just for our family of five? Thankfully, NO! You can join us! We cannot hope to impact such a dark place without help from healthy churches back in the U.S. So, what can you do?

1. Pray! Pick up a prayer card. By taking a card and signing up for our prayer updates, the hard soil of Japanese souls will slowly become fertile for the fruit of the Gospel.



- 2. Give! You already do this, but giving to the Cooperative Program through the Southern Baptist Convention allows thousands of IMB missionaries to continue this kind of work. You can also give directly to the IMB through the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering. We are always available to share through Skype what is happening in Japan. We do not require or ask for any special donations to our specific family.
- 3. Send & Go! Your church probably already has teams that invest in other missions, but we would ask each church to consider sending teams to Japan. Short-term teams are an essential part of our ministry, and they are sure to have life-changing experiences as they proclaim the Gospel to many who have never heard. Could God be calling people from your church to GO to Japan? If so, where would you start? We want to be your first point of contact as you explore these questions and more. The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few and we believe that God may be calling workers from your congregation to join us!

Operation Christmas Child Q&A

What is Operation Christmas Child?

Operation Christmas Child is a project of Samaritan's Purse, an international relief organization. Our mission is to provide local partners around the world with shoeboxes filled with small toys, hygiene items, and school supplies as a means of reaching out to children in their own communities with the Good News of Jesus Christ. We ship these simple gifts outside the United States to children affected by war, poverty, natural disaster, famine, and disease; and to children living on Native American reservations in the U.S.

Can I find out where my shoebox is sent?

Yes! You can <u>Follow Your Box</u> and discover the destination of your shoebox by making the \$9 shipping donation online. Just print and attach your unique shipping label to your shoebox gift.

Who started Operation Christmas Child?

The program was started in the United Kingdom in 1990 by Dave and Jill Cooke.

Three years after this beginning, the Wales-based shoebox gift project merged in a partnership with Samaritan's Purse, allowing us to share 20 years of expertise in relief and aid work with the project, and expand the reach of the shoebox gifts to more than 28,000 children that year. Since 1993, Operation Christmas Child has delivered gift-filled shoeboxes to over 146 million children in more than 100 countries.

Why shoebox gifts?

Shoebox gifts are a way to demonstrate God's love in a tangible way to needy children around the world, and together with the local church worldwide, to share the Good News of Jesus Christ.

What happens after my shoebox gift is delivered?

Our local ministry partners distribute your shoeboxes to children in their communities. After receiving shoebox gifts, many boys and girls are invited to enroll in The Greatest Journey, our 12-lesson discipleship program. Through the program, our local ministry partners are able to establish long-term, caring relationships with children and families by sharing the love of Jesus Christ. Visit www.operationchristmaschild.com to learn more about the eternal impact of a shoebox.

Are gifts delivered by Christmas?

The shoebox gifts are shipped out from our processing centers by the middle of December, and depending on the distance they must travel, some are delivered by Christmas—primarily those in Central/South America and Eastern Europe. Most of the gifts are sent via ship. Although the collection of Operation Christmas Child gifts is during the Thanksgiving/Christmas season, the delivery of some gifts is sometimes delayed due to international shipping. They may not clear customs in receiving countries until spring. In addition, many countries that receive the gifts must transport the gifts to rural areas using very poor roads. Distributions typically occur from late December through spring each year, extending the joy of Christmas to children that receive them!

Can I sponsor the child who receives my shoebox gift?

Operation Christmas Child is unable to facilitate this; however, if you are contacted by your recipient child, you may be able to build a relationship with them. Samaritan's Purse does have a <u>gift catalog</u> with several items supporting young children, such as a donation for a week's supply of food for a hungry baby. You can also give a scholarship to a child to participate in The Greatest Journey discipleship program. It takes \$6 to provide a child the opportunity to participate and receive discipleship materials including a certificate and New Testament in their language. Donors can fund one child, equip a church, or sponsor a country.

Is this project forcing religion on the child who gets the gift?

Samaritan's Purse and Operation Christmas Child seek to demonstrate God's love in a tangible way through each shoebox gift. One of our core values is to never be manipulative. We work in and through local volunteers in each country that understand their context and are respectful to the people they serve. At the same time, we do seek to share the Gospel wherever we go, which can be challenging at times. In some regions, we are not permitted to distribute literature, but we are still grateful for the opportunity to bless the children with gift boxes carefully prepared by people who love children. Boys and girls do not have to do or say anything to receive their gifts.
