Fall 2018 Life Group Courses

The fall 2018 Life Group semester begins Wednesday, September 5, 2018. There will be afterschool activities for children and teenagers, and dinner is available at 5:30 pm for folks who plan to attend Wednesday evening courses. After dinner, stay and join a Life Group at 6:30 pm. The courses that will be offered are as follows:

Prayer Meeting—Devote yourselves to prayer, keeping alert in it with an attitude of thanksgiving (Colossians 4:2). Prayer is foundational to the Christian faith. Let's gather with like-minded believers and see for yourself how God answers the prayers of His people. The Deacon of the Week will lead this weekly time of intercession in the Fishers of Men classroom each Wednesday evening at 6:30 pm.

His Needs, Her Needs—In the classic bestseller His Needs, Her Needs, Willard F. Harley, Jr., provides guidance for becoming more loving to your spouse, thereby eliminating the problems that often lead to extramarital affairs. Join facilitator Dr. Jim Browning in the Annex each Wednesday at 6:30 pm for this video-driven study for the married or nearly married. The cost of the materials is \$15 per couple.

Apologetics—Simply defined, "apologetics" is the defense of the Christian faith. Ron Bluff uses reason and evidence from the Old Testament Book of Genesis to seek out answers to questions about the Bible. You'll find this course each Wednesday at 6:30 pm in the T.E.L. Classroom.

We Saved You a Seat (women's study)—"How are you?" In today's busy world, we're wired to appear "fine," warding off authenticity and shielding ourselves from judgment. We hide behind the hum of busyness to escape intimate friendships with the women God has placed in our lives. But we do want a seat at the table. Comparison, envy, and entitlement often stop us from pulling out a chair at the table. Friendship can be hard, making new friends even harder, and maintaining genuine friendship the hardest of all. In this 7-session Bible study, Lisa-Jo Baker explores our relationship with Jesus as the ultimate model for authentic friendship. So instead of chasing perfection, overcome your fear of being known and find the courage to connect. Join Sally Gaertner each Wednesday at 6:30 pm in the Green Room. The cost of the student book is \$13.

James: Faith/Works—James, the half-brother of Jesus, clarifies what the Christian life should look like for us all. The Book of James is filled with practical wisdom for Christians, calling us to live out genuine faith through good works, but it is also rooted in rich theology. This 13-session study examines the core message of James: the relationship between faith and works. Thomas Welfel facilitates this study by Pastor Matt Chandler (The Village Church) each Wednesday at 6:30 pm in God's Playhouse. The cost of the learner workbook is \$13.

The Quest (women's mid-week study)— We have this innate need to question and seek after what we don't know or understand. In this 6-session Bible study by Beth Moore, women will delve into Scripture to explore how God created us to seek after Him—a God who desires to be found and known. In this lifelong quest of faith, learn to develop your intimacy with Him and embrace the adventure that comes with living a life for God. Mary-Ellen Long will facilitate this class each Wednesday morning at 10:00 am in the Annex. The cost of the participant workbook is \$10.

More Than Moms (mid-week study for moms)— There's no such thing as being "just" a mom. God has designed motherhood as part of His greater plan to draw people to Himself—instilling all women, whether called to traditional mothering or not, with an eternal purpose in nurturing others. Join Darlene McKeen as she leads the Gloria Furman study, Missional Motherhood. Meet each 1st & 3rd Friday at Helton Nature Park (15662 FM 775), and 2nd & 4th Friday in the church's Family Life Center. Darlene will distribute the books the first session. The cost of the book is \$12.

Safety Committee

At a recent Business Meeting, First Baptist Church of Floresville (FBCF) authorized the creation of a Safety Committee. The Committee on Committees created this committee and recruited members to fill the new positions.

FBCF feels it is prudent, in light of recent events in our state and in our nation, to develop policies and procedures that, when implemented, will minimize or negate harm to our members and visitors in the unlikely event that disaster strikes.

The Safety Committee is charged with developing and implementing Safety Policy, a FBCF Safety Operating Manual, and procedures to implement the Safety Policies.

The Safety Committee has developed policies and procedures for the following unlikely scenarios:

- Medical Emergencies,
- Acts of God such as the following: tornadoes, hurricanes, floods, earthquakes, etc.
- Active Shooter.

Our initial focus is on greater monitoring of the Sanctuary, Nursery, and Family Life Center. Due to insufficient resources, we will only be able to cover Sunday School (Bible Study Hour) and second service on Sunday. We are currently working on procedures for Wednesday evening activities. We hope to have the Wednesday evening procedures developed to be implemented in the near future.

Our procedures include Greeters in the parking lots before and after service. The greeters will likely have radios to effectively and constantly communicate with the Safety Committee Chair or Vice-Chair. These radios are shock-resistant, waterproof, link with the National Weather Service, and contain flashlights in the event of a power outage.

Our future plans include purchasing and installing, in phases, fish-eye cameras at key locations along with equipment for a monitoring control center.

Our desired goal is to have in place procedures to react appropriately and quickly to minimize or negate vandalism and harm to our members and visitors.
