Wilson County will hold a collection day for any household hazardous waste, used tires, used electronics, and pharmaceutical waste on Saturday, October 20, 2018, from 8am to Noon, at the Precinct 3 Yard at 511 7th Street in Sutherland Springs. This event is for residents of Wilson County only, and proof of address is required. Residential waste only; no businesses. There is no charge, but some items cannot be accepted. What to Bring:

Acids, Antifreeze, Tires (with no rims), Batteries, Used automotive fluids (and filters), Household cleaning products (and those labeled "caution," "warning," or "poison"), Paint products (including varnish & solvents), Pool chemicals, Lawn & garden chemicals, Herbicides & pesticides, Small appliances, TVs (no wooden console), Computer components & monitors, Pet Medication, Vitamins & herbal supplements, Prescription & nonprescription meds, Inhalers (leave all meds in original containers & black out personal information;

What NOT to Bring:

Tractor tires, Agricultural chemicals, Large appliances, Containers larger than 5 gallons, Explosives, Large propane cylinders, Radioactive materials, Industrial waste, Ammunition, Items with asbestos, Construction waste, Household/office furniture, Oxygen tanks, syringes, sharps, & lancets.

Safety Committee

At a recent Business Meeting, First Baptist Church of Floresville (FBCF) authorized the creation of a Safety Committee. The Committee on Committees created this committee and recruited members to fill the new positions.

FBCF feels it is prudent, in light of recent events in our state and in our nation, to develop policies and procedures that, when implemented, will minimize or negate harm to our members and visitors in the unlikely event that disaster strikes.

The Safety Committee is charged with developing and implementing Safety Policy, a FBCF Safety Operating Manual, and procedures to implement the Safety Policies.

The Safety Committee has developed policies and procedures for the following unlikely scenarios:

- Medical Emergencies,
- Acts of God such as the following: tornadoes, hurricanes, floods, earthquakes, etc.
- Active Shooter.



Our initial focus is on greater monitoring of the Sanctuary, Nursery, and Family Life Center. Due to insufficient resources, we will only be able to cover Sunday School (Bible Study Hour) and second service on Sunday. We are currently working on procedures for Wednesday evening activities. We hope to have the Wednesday evening procedures developed to be implemented in the near future.

Our procedures include Greeters in the parking lots before and after service. The greeters will likely have radios to effectively and constantly communicate with the Safety Committee Chair or Vice-Chair. These radios are shock-resistant, waterproof, link with the National Weather Service, and contain flashlights in the event of a power outage.

Our future plans include purchasing and installing, in phases, fish-eye cameras at key locations along with equipment for a monitoring control center.

Our desired goal is to have in place procedures to react appropriately and quickly to minimize or negate vandalism and harm to our members and visitors.

A Word from the Sudolcans in the Philippines

As Sherry and I recently wrapped up a ministry trip, we had a few hours with nothing scheduled before our flight back to Manila. Our hosts took us to the ruins of an old mansion on a sugar plantation. The mansion was lovingly built by a husband in honor of his wife who had passed away. During WW2, the husband burned the mansion down because he didn't want the occupying Japanese forces to use the mansion as a headquarters. What a tragedy!

Two things struck me about the ruins. First, our treasures here on earth simply will not last. No matter how determined you are, you simply will have to say goodbye to all your possessions at some point when your life is over. Often we see our treasures disappear even before our lives are over. That is a tragedy the owner of this mansion experienced. That should encourage us to invest wisely in things that have eternal value and bring eternal joy. Jesus told us that in Matthew 6:19-21.

The second thing I was reminded of about the ruins was that God can restore brokenness and make something good out of it. These ruins have become a beautiful tourist location and so are now once again bringing joy to people. It's not the same usefulness as it had before, yet it has once again become useful. God often works through our tragedies to accomplish something for His glory and for our good. Read Romans 8:28 and be encouraged.

Sherry and I, along with TLWPH staff Kat & Oda, and the TLWPH volunteers Marg & RM, spent 9 days in the Western Visayas Islands (the middle group of Islands in the Philippines). Close to 500 students in a variety of schools and churches heard God's message of hope and purity on this trip. Gospel seeds were planted, and we are praying for God to bring about a great harvest.

As you pray and give to the things God is doing, you are expanding your Kingdom impact and increasing your eternal joy. One great way you can do that is by supporting the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering. I would encourage you to begin setting aside some money now so you can cheerfully give to that ministry. For God's glory, for the good of all people, and for your eternal joy!

- 1. First Baptist Church pays our pastor/staff salaries, covers utilities, purchases literature and cares for our facility with your tithes and offerings. - State convention messengers vote on what percentage of these funds stay in the state and what percentage is forwarded to the Cooperative Program. The State convention funds collegiate ministries, disaster relief, state seminaries, and a variety of mission work around the state. The Mary Hill Davis Offering funds state mission efforts.
- 3. Slightly more than half of these Cooperative Program funds go to the International Mission Board (comprising 37% of IMB's total budget) and the remainder to other SBC entities including the North American Mission Board, the Ethics & Religious Liberty Commission, seminaries, and other agencies. The Annie Armstrong Easter Offering provides additional funds for the North American Mission Board.
- 4. Every penny your church gives to the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering directly funds your IMB missionaries as they work to bring unreached peoples to Christ.
