Appreciating Your Pastor in October

Let the elders who rule well be counted worthy of double honor, especially those who labor in the word and doctrine. I Tim. 5:17

October is Pastor Appreciation Month. While that may not seem like a big deal to you, I am confident it is to your pastor.

Shepherding God's flock can be a lonely and weary task at times. Hundreds of pastors leave the ministry each year. I personally minister to discouraged pastors on a regular basis, so I know firsthand the importance of public affirmation.

Both the Old and New Testaments record stories of men who felt the loneliness and weariness of ministry. In 1 Kings 19, Elijah slumped under a broom tree and longed to die. He later told God that he felt all alone in the ministry. Paul lamented in 2 Timothy 4 that no man stood with him. God eventually showed Elijah that he had 7,000 supporters, and Paul came to understand that God was with him, even when he felt deserted by men.

Pastor Appreciation Month is designed to keep your pastor out from under the broom tree! An encouraged pastor is a blessing to his congregation and his family. A church can encourage and bless their pastor simply by treating him and his wife to a date night at a nice restaurant. In fact, you do not have to wait until October; you could give them a date night on a regular basis.

Here is another way to encourage and bless your pastor. Ask each Sunday School/small group to donate gift cards for restaurants, home improvement stores, sporting goods stores, bookstores, etc. On any Sunday in October, have a "Pastor Appreciation Day" and publicly present the gift cards, along with hand-written notes, to the pastor and his wife. This small gesture will go much further than you can imagine. It does not matter so much what you do, just that you do something meaningful for your pastor in October.

The Apostle Paul spoke about the weight of the churches he led. By observing Pastor Appreciation Day, you are literally lightening your pastor's load. Please do not let October pass without publicly appreciating your pastor!



Technology and the Christian Life

A Word from Pastor Matt Keller:

I want to say thank you for allowing me to challenge everyone to fast from all unnecessary use of your cell phone and social media for one week. If you participated, I hope that it was beneficial for you. My prayer is that this helped our church put these things in proper perspective. Below you will find the motivation behind teaching and challenging the students and the whole church.

Would you consider doing a monthly evaluation of how you use your cell phone? Pick a day of the month to read Proverbs 3:4-5, go to the Lord in prayer, and ask the Lord, "Father, show me if my phone is getting in the way of me loving You in every part of my life. Father, show me if my phone is getting in the way of showing the love of Jesus to others." I plan on praying this the first day of every month. Would you be willing to join me in this prayer?



Please consider the following from the book 12 Ways Your Phone Is Changing You by Tony Reinke:

- Our phones amplify our addiction to distractions and thereby splinter our perception of our place in time;
- Our phones push us to evade the limits of embodiment and thereby cause us to treat one another harshly;
- Our phones feed our craving for immediate approval and promise to hedge against our fear of missing out;
- Our phones undermine key literary skills and, because of our lack of discipline, make it increasingly difficult for us to identify
 ultimate meaning;
- Our phones offer us a buffet of produced media and tempt us to indulge in visual vices;
- Our phones overtake and distort our identity and tempt us toward unhealthy isolation and loneliness;

Then consider how we can preserve our spiritual health in the age of the smartphone:

- We minimize unnecessary distractions in life to hear from God and to find our place in God's unfolding history;
- We embrace our flesh-and-blood embodiment and handle one another with grace and gentleness;
- We aim at God's ultimate approval and find that, in Christ, we have no ultimate regrets to fear;
- We treasure the gift of literacy and prioritize God's Word;
- We listen to God's voice in creation and find a fountain of delight in the unseen Christ;
- We treasure Christ to be molded into his image and seek to serve the legitimate needs of our neighbors.

Scripture makes life-focus possible in the digital age, and it does so when Jesus boils down the purpose and aim of our lives into two goals: **treasure God with your whole being**, and then **pour out your God-centered joy in love for others**. On these two commands all other smartphone laws depend.

Acids, Antifreeze, Tires (with no rims), Batteries, Used automotive fluids (and filters), Household cleaning products (and those labeled "caution," "warning," or "poison"), Paint products (including varnish & solvents), Pool chemicals, Lawn & garden chemicals, Herbicides & pesticides, Small appliances, TVs (no wooden console), Computer components & monitors, Pet Medication, Vitamins & herbal supplements, Prescription & non-prescription meds, Inhalers (leave all meds in original containers & black out personal information;

What NOT to Bring:

Tractor tires, Agricultural chemicals, Large appliances, Containers larger than 5 gallons, Explosives, Large propane cylinders, Radioactive materials, Industrial waste, Ammunition, Items with asbestos, Construction waste, Household/office furniture, Oxygen tanks, syringes, sharps, & lancets.

Operation Christmas Child FAQs

What is Operation Christmas Child? Operation Christmas Child (OCC) is a project of Samaritan's Purse, an international relief organization. Their mission is to provide local partners around the world with shoeboxes filled with small toys, hygiene items, and school supplies as a means of reaching out to children in their own communities with the Good News of Jesus Christ. OCC ships these simple gifts outside the United States to children affected by war, poverty, natural disaster, famine, and disease; and to children living on Native American reservations in the U.S.

How do I pack my shoebox gift? Everything you need to learn how to pack a shoebox gift can be found at https://www.samaritanspurse.org/operation-christmas-child/pack-a-shoe-box/. That includes what kind of box to use, what items can be included, how to learn the destination of your shoebox gift, and much more!

What is the \$9 suggested donation per box? The \$9 per gift is a suggested donation. This donation is critical for Operation Christmas Child to collect, process, and ship shoe-

box gifts to more than 100 countries. It also provides for ministry materials such as The Greatest Gift Gospel Booklet and The Ministry Partner Guide. We encourage those who are unable to include the \$9 per box to consider asking a group in their church or a family member to sponsor this part of the shoebox gift.

Are gifts delivered by Christmas? The shoebox gifts are shipped out from our processing centers by the middle of December, and depending on the distance they must travel, some are delivered by Christmas—primarily those in Central/South America and Eastern Europe. Most of the gifts are sent via ship. Although the collection of Operation Christmas Child gifts is during the Thanksgiving/Christmas season, the delivery of some gifts is sometimes delayed due to international shipping. They may not clear customs in receiving countries until spring. In addition, many countries that receive the gifts must transport the gifts to rural areas using very poor roads. Distributions typically occur from late December through spring each year, extending the joy of Christmas to children that receive them!

What happens after my shoebox gift is delivered? Our local ministry partners distribute your shoeboxes to children in their communities. After receiving shoebox gifts, many boys and girls are invited to enroll in The Greatest Journey, our 12-lesson discipleship program. Through the program, our local ministry partners are able to establish long-term, caring relationships with children and families by sharing the love of lesus Christ.

Missionary Moments

The fall semester is well underway at the Belize Bible College, the only accredited Christian college in the Central American country of Belize. There are currently 13 students working on degrees in theology, and 5 students pursuing degrees in music, with several independent studies music students who take after-hours classes. This semester, some of the courses being offered are: Epistle of Romans, Speech Communications, Eschatology, and Managing Finances God's

The campus is also being used for electrical training courses that have been taught in the Toledo District of Southern Belize for the past (28) years as STTI. The College is in hopes of starting other trade courses for Technical/Trades certificates in the future.

Also in the future are plans to establish a radio station, Bible College Radio, to service the region around the College. Many exciting things are happening.

FBC's former student pastor, Aaron Coffey, serves as the Dean of Students and professor there. Ashley Coffey teaches music classes, specifically piano and voice. The Coffeys are responsible for raising their own financial support and do not receive a salary for their work in Belize, so one-time or ongoing gifts would be appreciated.
