## Regathering the Church Survey: Coming Out of COVID

First Baptist Church's leadership faced some difficult decisions due to the COVID-19 crisis back in March. We ended normal, physical congregational gatherings and transitioned to remote online gatherings and streaming worship services.

However, as some states are beginning to lift stay-at-home restrictions, our leadership is again facing difficult decisions about when and how we will begin to gather again. There are numerous needs to consider and questions to ask. Our leaders are prayerfully listening to government officials and health experts to make the best decision for their congregation. There is another group, however, that our pastors want to hear from before starting the re-entry process – YOU, the congregation.

YOU will help FBC's leadership better assess our current situation and make the proper plans before we begin welcoming worshipers and guests back to the building.

To help with the process, and with guidance from the good folks at LifeWay Research, FBC has developed a survey that will assist as these decisions are being made. The questionnaire asks about expectations regarding when to begin worship services, people's comfort level in attending large and small groups, precautions that should be made for the entire church and specific ministry areas, and more.

Church leaders won't be able to please everyone when making decisions about gathering physically again, but having congregational feedback will hopefully avoid undue stress on people. The pastors certainly don't want to make radical changes that most find unnecessary.

A link to complete the survey will be emailed to folks on the church's distribution list. Please answer the questions honestly to help determine what the best course of action is for FBCF, and pray that the Lord gives FBC's leadership wisdom as they navigate this season.

Dear Family and Friends,

Greetings from the United States! As you may have read in our e-mail newsletter, we have been relocated from Indonesia back to the USA. Even though we are not abroad, our Global Internship Program will continue in an alternative capacity. In other words, your financial partnership is still greatly appreciated.

It has been an incredibly emotional couple of weeks. We had 24 hours to pack and prepare to leave the country. Living there for seven months was great, but not being able to say goodbye to all of our friends and contacts was difficult. The country is now on lockdown. Please continue to pray for Indonesia. We hope there is an opportunity to return overseas in the summer or fall, but only time will tell. In the meantime, Bethany Global University (BGU) is working on intercultural outreach opportunities in the USA so that we can continue our intercultural training as we work through college.

The support you have extended to JP and me so far has allowed us to live and interact in ministry overseas. Moving ahead, for the next 7-8 months, your continued partnership will allow us to continue to live and interact in ministry among unreached people groups that are located here in the United States. We completely understand if you are unable to continue supporting us in this season as we know a lot is going on right now with our economy. However, if you are able to continue supporting us, we want you to know it would be greatly appreciated and helpful, as we will have to continue raising partnership in this season. Because BGU is a tuition-paid university, none of the funding you share with us goes toward the cost of my education or tuition (because Bethany scholarships the education through grants and funding they have access to).

We will continue communicating with you through monthly updates and as we find out new information. Please keep us in prayer during this season and let us know how we can be praying for you and your family.

## Parents, You Can't Anticipate God; You Can Only Trust Him

I love child dedication days at church. These aren't baptisms; they aren't confirmations; at least in our faith traditions, these are commitments and promises. Parents stand in front of the congregation with their children, and those parents promise that they will raise their kids to know and love God's Word and the gospel we find there. But it's also a promise for the congregation to make back to the family—that as fellow members of the Body of Christ, that they will also contribute as they are able to that child's spiritual growth and understanding of the gospel.

It's a beautiful thing. It's a wonderful reminder of the fact that we are in this thing together. And as a parent who has stood three times before a congregation like that, it's an incredible encouragement to know there is a whole group of people who are in the thick of it with us. A child dedication is all those things—but one thing it is not... a guarantee.

The parents might center their home on God's Word; they might diligently do family devotions and raise their children in the midst of the things of God; they might model grace and truth as they raise that child; and the congregation might come faithfully alongside those parents to do the same. But even in the midst of all that, who can say what decisions that little boy or girl will make as they live their lives?

This is one of the reasons why parenting is, if nothing else, an exercise in faith. It is because a parent has to exercise and work hard at their faith as that child they love, treasure, and value goes out into the world of school, first jobs, first dates, driver's licenses, and eventually out on their own. There are few things, at least in my experience, that are as painfully difficult to exercise faith in the middle of than parenting.

As parents, we want guarantees. We want formulas. We want a sure-fire, tried-and-true way to make absolutely sure that our kids will grow into mature, Jesus-loving, children of God. But we don't have that, and if we think we do, we are mistaken. It's a mistake to think that verses like Proverbs 22:6 is a promise:

Train up a child in the way he should go, And when he is old he will not depart from it.

This is a proverb; it's not a promise, and it's important we understand the difference. God is not offering a formula here. He is not promising that, if we really invest in the spiritual development of our children, that they will grow in their faith. Rather, proverbs like these describe the general way the world works. We don't take a guarantee from this passage, but we do take all the encouragement in the world to train up our children in the way they should go.

If there was a formula? If there was a promise? If there was a guarantee? Well, if there were, we could anticipate God. But, parents, you can't anticipate God; you can only trust Him.

How do we show, then, that we are trusting God? We are prayerful about the hearts of our kids. We teach and guard and discipline and train with the Bible at the center. We do our best to treat our children the way our Heavenly Father treats us. These are all tangible examples of our trust, for we do these things in faith.

And, as with all things, we leave the results ultimately to Him.
