New business will be presented by the Committee on Committees, the Personnel Committee, and a date change for the December Business Meeting.

The fall 2020 Life Group semester begins Wednesday, September 9, 2020. Classes and other activities will be limited, and we will not prepare Wednesday Night Suppers, so please plan accordingly. A children's worship hour will be offered at 6:30 pm, and students will have Bible study at 6:30 pm also. There are no after-school activities for children and students. The courses offered are:

Prayer Meeting—Devote yourselves to prayer, keeping alert in it with an attitude of thanksgiving (Colossians 4:2). Prayer is foundational to the Christian faith. Let's gather with like-minded believers and see for yourself how God answers the prayers of His people. Pastor Terry Smith will lead this weekly time of intercession in the Fishers of Men classroom each Wednesday evening at 6:30 pm.

Challenging the Secular World View of Genesis (in-person) — The secular world view of the history presented in Genesis can present questions for many Christians. This class aims to strengthen your faith by providing answers and in turn challenging the secular worldview. Bro. Ron Bluff will lead this class each Wednesday at 6:30 pm in the TEL classroom.

The Story (via ZOOM) — The Story is the story of the Bible, God's great love affair with humanity. It sweeps you into the unfolding progression of Bible people and events from Genesis to Revelation, told as one grand narrative. Tom and Jean Harris will begin the study of the book *The Story* by Max Lucado. This is a 31-week overview of the entire Bible in chronological order. The emphasis is on the continuity of the Bible with Jesus as the central figure. This discussion-based study is offered on Wednesday evenings at 6:30 pm. ## NEWS FROM JP & SARAH CANADY

Thank you so much for your support as Sarah and I are being led by the Lord through this season of change! We are transitioning well into our new lives as missionary interns in the Twin Cities. We miss our friends in Indo, but we are excited to be joining the work here in Minnesota. These past few months have been filled with ups and downs all while getting a vision of what is happening here in the Twin Cities and then being better equipped to go out and share the good news with people.



The month of July was spent mostly getting used to life back on campus. Sarah and I are staying in a guest room in the Adkins building on campus where we share a kitchen and a bathroom with another married intern couple until Sarah graduates next Spring 2021. Summer has been beautiful in Minnesota and we have been able to enjoy walks and spend time in the sun before the cold sets in. One big thing we were able to enjoy in July was traveling to Utah to celebrate my brother Elisha's wedding! It was a wonderful trip where Sarah and I were able to stop in Colorado Springs, CO, to see the mountains with my dad and sister, Rebekah, and her husband, Noah, before driving over to Utah. It was a beautiful wedding and time with my family. Congrats again to Elisha and Kennan!

At the beginning of August, we attended an orientation where we heard from local pastors about the reality of ministering in South Minneapolis in the aftermath of George Floyd and the riots. It was good to hear that through all of the tragedy and chaos that God is continuing to work to bring hope through the gospel to the people in this area. There's no need to be concerned about our safety. Please know that our leadership are being very cautious and smart about ministering in these areas of town. Also, the ministries that Sarah and I are in are not directly in that part of town, but many of our friends are ministering there.

We also attended a 3-day seminar hosted by the school on exponential discipleship making. It was really helpful to learn strategies of exponential discipleship making from the Bethany staff and other global missionaries who served overseas for many years and used and saw the fruit of the principles that we were learning about.

For the remainder of our internship, Sarah and I will be working with two different ministries. The first is the Hospitality Center for Chinese (HCC) students. This is a ministry that has been working on the University of Minnesota campuses for over 26 years offering hospitality through meals, activities, outings, English language tutoring, and friendship. In the last 2 years, they have expanded from just Chinese students to all international students in the Twin Cities area. Sarah and I will be working directly with the staff there to help plan and coordinate events for international students to meet and form relationships with local Christians and other American students. The ministry is currently mostly on the U of M campuses in Minneapolis and St. Paul, but part of our goal will be reaching out to other universities in the area in order to connect with their international students so that we can get them connected to local believers by hosting hospitality events. We hope to make friends with these students as well, so that we can begin to share Christ with them.

The other ministry that Sarah and I will be working with is S.A.L.T. It stands for Somali Adult Literacy Training. They are a part of Arrive Ministries that works here in Minnesota to share Jesus with refugees and immigrants. We will be providing tutoring services for Somali adults and children. We will also be practicing a weekly Discovery Bible Study with a team of interns also involved in this ministry with the hope of being able to host our own DBS with the Somali relationships that come from tutoring.

We want to thank you again for your support of us in prayer, finances, and hospitality (or all of the above!) Sarah and I are determined to keep running this race that God has given us. Here are few a suggestions about ways you can pray for us:

- Pray that Sarah and I are able to find the "person of peace" in the communities that we will be ministering in so that we can share Christ with them;
- Pray that Sarah and I keep our dependence fully on the Lord and for continued endurance through all the changes this season;
- Pray for the people of the Twin Cities area who are lost and without hope, that they will find peace and justice in Christ over all else;
- Pray for the communities of the immigrants and refugees, especially the Somali community, that doors would open and many would come to know Isa Almasih (Jesus) as Savior and Lord;
- Pray for the international student community, that they would not live in fear and that they would come and experience the true love of Christ for them through His body, the Church, and thus seek Jesus and be saved.
