Although our ministry in Belize will be primarily focused on serving at Belize Bible College, as God allows we will be involved in other aspects of the mission. Yemeri Grove Christian Church has been planted on the

campus of the college and we will be serving there. They are currently meeting in a tent due to COVID restrictions. In addition, we plan on participating as God allows in some of the numerous outreach trips that this ministry does to minister to people living in remote villages along the Sarstun River. The trips include gospel presentations, medical ministry, providing clean water filters, and even drilling water wells.


