St. Anselm, the 11th century Archbishop of Canterbury in England, wrote a number of important theological works. The one that remains most meaningful to me is entitled *Proslogium*, meaning "A Discourse." He had initially planned to entitle it, *Faith Seeking Understanding*. The original title sticks with me better because those three words sum up my Christian life.

We've just completed a time of symbolic preparation and waiting through our celebration of Advent. It was another time when we exercised our *faith seeking* to *understand* Christ's coming to us in human form. The music, the sermons, the Advent readings and candles, all contributed both to our faith and to our understanding.

Now we're facing still another twelve-month period of waiting. But, we have new questions: "What does 2023 hold for us?" "Will the Astros repeat as Word Series Champs?" And, most importantly, "Who will be our new pastor?" Questions and waiting. In fact, the entire year will be a time of waiting, from day to day, week to week, month to month until, well, until this same time next year. The good news is that the answers to all our questions will be discovered in the waiting.

Waiting is, admittedly, uncomfortable. May we be strengthened by the fact that the *long-awaited* birth of Jesus, led to his crucifixion for the forgiveness of our sins, and his crucifixion led to his resurrection for our eternal life.

So it will be in 2023. We wait, and the new pastor will providentially arrive. Please pray for your Pastor Search Committee. Pray for them to carry out their work with supernatural discernment, wisdom, and strength. Please keep in mind that the process is never simple and can take up a significant amount of time. Until then, they and we must wait. But, trust that God's best will come from the waiting.

I look forward to 2023. I'm confident that, despite what might happen to us in so many ways which are unknown to us, the Almighty will not be surprised and He is not absent. Our part in understanding is to recall with robust faith, the words of Psalm 91:

1 He who dwells in the shelter of the Most High


will abide in the shadow of the Almighty.


Missionaries

Message from the Pastor Search Team

Sometime in the first century AD, the Apostle Paul wrote to his colleague Titus about an important task he had given the man:

"This is why I left you in Crete, so that you might put what remained into order, and appoint elders in every town as I directed you—"

Titus 1:5 ESV

Among many things, these men were to be pastors of the Lord's churches who were "able to give instruction in sound doctrine and also rebuke those who contradict it". Elsewhere Paul writes that such a person should be "able to teach... correcting his opponents with gentleness".

It's easy to imagine how a man like Titus, personally trained and taught by the Apostle Paul, could recognize men like this.

Titus himself would be well-trained in sound doctrine and likely taught some of the very men he would appoint to pastor these churches.

Here in Floresville Texas, in 2023, our congregation has a similar task: to find and call someone with the same character and sound Christian doctrine, prepared to teach and gently correct when necessary. When put in these terms, it seems almost an impossible goal for a group of regular church members. After all, we're just regular folks, not experts in doctrine or theology like


