Thoughts From Pastor

Whatever happened to Simon of Cyrene?

Blackie Sherrod was a legend among Texas sportswriters, being voted Texas sportswriter of the year 16 times. Blackie died seven years ago today, as I'm writing this, on April 28, 2016, at age 96.

Blackie's Sunday column in *The Dallas Morning News* was entitled "Scattershooting" and always began with the line: "Scattershooting while wondering whatever happened to . . ."

I never met Blackie Sherrod, but I do know another pretty good writer, Jim Denison, who produces a daily blog known as the *Denison Forum*. In one, he reminds us of Jesus' pain even before His crucifixion.

Jesus, the falsely-accused now-convict, began the terrible trek toward Golgotha carrying his cross himself (John 19:17); but eventually, he collapsed under its estimated weight of 165 pounds. Roman soldiers looked around and quickly pressed into service one Simon of Cyrene, a city in North Africa identified today as Tripoli, Libya.

So, with apologies to the late Blackie Sherrod, here I sit, typing and wondering, "Whatever happened to Simon of Cyrene?" And, then in my best Keith Morrison voice, I'll add: "And, oh, there is a story to tell."

The story begins with Mark who says that Simon is "the father of Alexander and Rufus" (Mk 15:21). Mark tells us nothing more about these two men which probably indicates that his readers were so familiar with them, that their names alone were sufficient to identify them.

Here the plot thickens, because Mark's Gospel was likely written in Rome to members of the church at Rome. That's important because, in Paul's letter to the Romans, he writes: "Greet Rufus, a choice man in the Lord, also his mother and mine" (Rom 16:13). The early church believed this Rufus to be the same one Mark mentioned and Simon's son, a man who went on after his father's auspicious day with Jesus, to be of remarkable significance to the church. Thus, Rufus' mother was Simon's wife who figuratively-speaking, became Paul's "mother," providing him with support in his ministry.

Had enough? No? Good! Because, Acts 13:1 mentions "prophets and teachers" in the church at Antioch in Syria. Among them were two men, "Simeon called Niger" and "Lucius of Cyrene." Simeon is another spelling of Simon, and "Niger" is the Latin word for "black" identifying a man with dark skin from Africa. The early church identified this Simon as, you guessed it, Simon of Cyrene, in Antioch with Lucius, another man originally from Cyrene, some 2,200 miles from their home.

Back to my question. Whatever happened to Simon of Cyrene? He became a leader in the most missionary-minded church in the early Christian world. The church at Antioch was a diverse (Acts 13:1) congregation that commissioned the Apostle Paul and sent him on his first missionary journey along with Barnabas. And, all of this started on the day Simon bore Jesus' cross—the cross upon which He would die, for Simon and for us all.

Grateful for Jesus, grateful for all of you!

Anyway, this is not a letter of resignation; instead, it is just letting you know what my plans are for now, and how the Lord may be leading me in the future.


